




A MURDER IS FIXED




NIMBU SAAB

This book tells the story of an unsung hero of the Kargil War–Neikezhakuo Kenguruse, playfully called 'Nimbu Saab' by his colleagues



in the army. The second battalion of the Rajputana Rifles played a crucial role in the War. One of its tasks was the defence of Point 4590, which it successfully completed but lost twenty-three soldiers. One of the fallen heroes was twenty-six-year-old captain Kenguruse, who led his men barefoot into combat in temperatures of -10 degrees.

Kenguruse was also the first martyr from Nagaland, a war hero who was awarded India's second highest gallantry award—the Maha Vir Chakra. Even so, his story remains relatively unknown.

Who was Nimbu Saab beyond his uniform, and the act of gallantry in which he lost his life? This book tells us all this and more, as we commemorate the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Kargil War.

The book is co-authored by the daughters of Kargil war martyr Major C.B. Dwivedi (SM).




FROM FIRE TO LIGHT

Rereading the Manusmrti

ARVIND SHARMA

From Fire to Light is an alternative reading of the Manusmṛti, which is currently regarded as a text designed by the higher castes, especially the



brāhmaṇas, to oppress the lower castes and women. This book accepts some of the conclusions associated with the existing interpretation but presents them in a new light, and mitigates and, at times, contradicts some of its other features. In doing so, it brings about a paradigm shift in our understanding of this ancient text.

Arvind Sharma, a renowned philosopher, argues that the present understanding of the Manusmṛti only tells one side of the story. He tries to demonstrate that this is limited to the point of being misleading (and sometimes downright wrong) when viewed in the light of textual, commentarial and historical evidence. From the fresh perspective that he brings to the text, the Manusmṛti does emerge as an attempt at social engineering, but of a rather different kind than imagined till now.

ARVIND SHARMA is the Birks professor of comparative religion in the School of Religious Studies at McGill University in Montreal, Canada. He has also taught at universities in Australia (Queensland, Sydney), the USA (Northeastern, Temple, Boston, Harvard) and India (Nalanda). Books authored by him include Gandhi: A Spiritual Biography, Hinduism and Its Sense of History, Religious Tolerance: A History and The Ruler's Gaze: A Study of British Rule over India from a Saidian Perspective.

The Nagarwala Scandal

On 24 May 1971, based on a telephone call purportedly from Prime Minister Indira Gandhi and her secretary, P.N. Haksar, the chief cashier at


the Parliament Street branch of the State Bank of India handed over ₹60 lakh to a stranger posing as the PM's courier. The money was supposedly meant for secret operations in East Pakistan. When the chief cashier approached PMO for a receipt, he was told that neither Haksar nor the PM had given any such instructions. He had been duped.

Within a few hours, Delhi Police recovered the cash and caught the man responsible for the heist, a former army captain—Rustom Sohrab Nagarwala. Subsequent events that included a botched police investigation, bungling by the lower judiciary, mysterious deaths of the accused and the principal investigator, and Indira Gandhi's unexplainable silence—led to the rise of several conspiracy theories.

Based on police records, press reports, depositions before the Justice Jaganmohan Reddy Commission and its report, *The Scam that Shook a Nation* is the first authoritative work on the scam, its investigation and its afterlife as a study in political corruption.

were the first to represent Indian on the world stage would be published as the *History of Services of Officers of the Indian Foreign Service* (*Branches A and B*). That slim, 'restricted—for official use only' volume is the inspiration for Nehru's First Recruits.

This book draws inspiration from that 1959 volume to present an anecdotal, investigative account of the men, and some women, who were the first to represent India on the world stage. It also provides a glimpse into an exciting era when India was emerging as a global leader in a postcolonial world. Notable names from the period include Brajesh Mishra who became A.B. Vajpayee's national security advisor, K. Natwar Singh who served as external affairs minister during Manmohan Singh's premiership, Chinmaya Gharekhan who shaped India's diplomacy at the United Nations and Romesh Bhandari who served as Indira Gandhi's foreign secretary.

In 1991, India began the process of liberalizing the economy. But it has been gradual—even import licensing (on consumer goods) was not fully

removed till 2001. Between 1991 and 2023, tariff liberalization was reversed twice—first between 1996–1997 to 1999–2000 and then from 2018–2019 onwards. Anti-dumping was also used extensively to exclude the imports of specific products from the most competitive sources.

Economist and chairperson of the Sixteenth Finance Commission Arvind Panagariya has closely observed the Indian economy over decades and written extensively about it. In this book, he has collected his writings from 1989 to the present day to provide an overview of the Indian economy from when liberalization started to where it has reached. The chapters in this book offer a window to the history of trade-policy changes, the factors driving them and their implications for the country's development and well-being.

DR ARVIND PANAGARIYA is chairperson of the Sixteenth Finance Commission. He was the first vice-chairman of NITI Aayog from January 2015 to August 2017. He holds a PhD in economics from Princeton University and is the author of over twenty books.






