
Vacuous detective P. Manjunath and his assistant, Heng, wrestle with an inscrutable mystery pickling their world, but their witless endeavours






It's love at first sight for DIG Ajay Rajvardhan from the National Investigation Agency when he sees fiery lawyer Asiya Khan in court as she




Mesmerized by the world of social media influencing and its quick fix for fame, Madhur Chopra aka Maddie escapes from Covid-infested Delhi


MARIA, JUST MARIA

Following the death of her grandfather, Maria has stopped speaking – not because she can't, but because she doesn't want to.



Now in a psychiatric hospital, as she begins the process of 'reconnecting with reality', Maria recalls her journey of being 'just Maria' – a girl born into a Syrian Christian family in Kerala, whose companions were: a grandfather who took her along to wander around the village and its toddy shops; a great-aunt with dementia; a dog with a penchant for philosophy; various long-dead family members; a patron saint who insisted on interfering in people's affairs; and Karthav – Jesus Christ – with whom Maria has regular conversations.

A GAME OF FIRE


1947. Amritsar. Guru Ram Das Serai has become a temporary refuge for Hindu and Sikh families fleeing the communal terror of Partition. One

of the volunteers providing succour to the new arrivals is Satnam Singh, who is struck by the extraordinary calm of an erudite-looking old man and his companion, a resolute young woman whose eyes seem haunted by the tragedies they have witnessed.

Taking the story forward from *Hymns* in *Blood*, A *Game of Fire* follows Satnam as he observes the rising tide of communal violence threaten his beloved Amritsar. Even as he shelters the elderly man and the young woman in his own home, his faith in placing humanity before religion is severely tested. Agg di Khed paints the picture of a city in turmoil and the unexpected heroes who rise from this catastrophe, its message as relevant today as it was when it was first published in Punjabi in 1948.

NANAK SINGH is widely regarded as the father of the Punjabi novel. He received the Sahitya Akademi Award in 1962 for *Ik Mian Do Talwaraan*. His novel *Pavitra Paapi* was made into a film in 1968, while *Chitta Lahu* was translated into the Russian by Natasha Tolstoy.

NAVDEEP SURI is a former Indian diplomat who has been striving to preserve the legacy of his grandfather Nanak Singh and to bring his works to a wider audience.



Subimal Misra - anarchist, activist, anti-establishment, experimental



'anti-writer' - was a contemporary master, and among India's greatest writers. Misra's works are confrontational, and meant to challenge and provoke readers morally, politically, and also in terms of what they expect from literature.

The Earth Quakes: Late Anti-Stories brings together Misra's final work – twenty stories from the 1991 to 2010. Thematically, the subjects range from the 'global' – the Gulf War of 1991 which heralded the post–Cold War unipolar world – to the very 'local' – the Singur movement of 2006 which led to the unseating of the all-powerful CPI(M) who ruled the state of West Bengal since 1977.

Unsurprisingly, it is as unique and unprecedented as each of the earlier volumes, and a fitting finale to the ground-breaking Subimal Misra translation project undertaken by translator-activist extraordinaire V. Ramaswamy.

SUBIMAL MISRA (1943–2023) has been called 'the only anti-establishment writer in Bengali'. The Golden Gandhi Statue from America, Wild Animals Prohibited, and This Could Have Become Ramayan Chamar's Tale were also published in Perennial.

V. RAMASWAMY lives in Kolkata and has been engaged in a multi-volume project to translate the fiction of Subimal Misra.

THE INCARCERATIONS

Bhima Koregaon and the Search for Democracy in India

ALPA SHAH

The Bhima Koregaon case has been described as incarcerating India's brightest minds and most committed civil rights activists, framing them



with flimsy evidence. When one digs deeper into those jailed and the causes they spent their lives defending, what is crucially revealed to be at stake is the search for social justice, and in turn the widening and deepening of democracy itself.

The Incarcerations shows the unravelling of Indian democracy through the story of the Bhima Koregaon case, in which sixteen people – scholars, lawyers, activists, artists, and poets – have been imprisoned. It thus shows how and why long-standing battles for democracy are being violently stifled by the muzzling of key contemporary voices representing the struggles of the marginalized. It also reveals how this silencing has gone together with the suppression of the freedom of the press, the co-option of the judiciary and the takeover of critical thought.

The rise of authoritarianism in the world's largest democracy is complex and one that the story of the Bhima Koregaon case lays bare.

ALPA SHAH is professor of anthropology at the London School of Economics. Her book, Nightmarch: Among India's Revolutionary Guerrillas, won the 2020 US Association for Political and Legal Anthropology Book Prize, was shortlisted for the 2019 UK Orwell Prize for Political Writing, the New India Book Foundation Prize and the US Victor Turner

Prize in Ethnographic Writing.


affair with the 'fierce creatures' who share our planet. This first volume of his fascinating memoir brings the India of the 1950s and the US of the '60s to life.

When his mother married and moved to Mumbai, Whitaker was transplanted from a conventional childhood in the US to – what was for him – the exciting world of India. At boarding school in Kodai, he kept a pet python under his bed and realized that all he really wanted to do was work with snakes. Sent to the US for college, Whitaker preferred snakes to lecture halls and left to work in a snake farm. The adventures that ensue are hair-raising and often hilarious.

Snakes, Drugs and Rock 'n' Roll tells the story of a boy who would become one of the greatest conservationists of his generation, discovering the wonders of India's extraordinary natural world.

ROMULUS EARL WHITAKER III (b. 1943) is renowned for establishing the Madras Snake Park, the Madras Crocodile Bank Trust, the Andaman and Nicobar Environmental Team, and for his work in conserving India's rain forests. He received the Rolex Award for Enterprise, the Whitley Award and in 2018, the Padma Shri.

JANAKI LENIN writes about wildlife and conservation, and the intermingling of human and animal destinies.







India in Free Fall

SANJAY JHA

India awaits the next general elections, in 2024, with breathless anticipation. Under Narendra Modi's decade-long tenure as Prime



Minister, the country has made worldwide headlines for its democratic downslide, crackdown on press freedoms, and a rise in crony capitalism, communal hate and caste bigotry, institutional debilitation, demagoguery, and the putting in place of a majoritarian infrastructure.

If these trends continue, the largest democracy in the world faces an uncertain fate. In this compelling and important new book, former Congress spokesperson Sanjay Jha argues that India appears to be in a state of free fall. Covering issues and subjects as potent as the othering of Muslim minorities, the bulldozing of citizen's rights and homes, the dismantling of the judiciary and the socio-economic mishandling of the Covid-19 pandemic, Jha investigates the questions that must urgently be asked before India goes to the polls, yet again.

The Great Unravelling

Since May 2014, under a resurgent Bharatiya Janata Party, it appears that the liberal, secular, scientific idea of India has come utterly undone. Institutions of governance that had weathered great turbulence in the past

seem to be disintegrating. The economy, once the celebrated 'India story', is in a shambles. Large sections of the media genuflect to the ruling dispensation. Meanwhile, the grand old party of India remains trapped in its past and unsure about its future.

In 2014, named after the year the BJP-led government came to power, Sanjay Jha examines what this means for the future of India. Even as he asks tough questions, Jha has not lost faith in Mahatma Gandhi's India. He writes of renewal, of hope. And the Congress, he firmly believes, is central to that revival of India.



I wake up shivering and with a sore throat. Is it Covid? I grab a test kit and wait for the result. Luckily all is well.


India was one of the countries hit hardest by the Covid pandemic, with a tragically high number of casualties. It also made some things an integral part of our lives: wearing masks, sanitizing, social distancing, isolating oneself.

None of this, however, is unique. Over the centuries, wave after wave of the devastating plague pandemic had impacted humanity in similar ways, and the responses to the threats it posed had been similar too. The history of the plague is, in a way, the story of modern civilization.

The Moral Contagion is an insightful and absorbing take on that story. Based on Julia Hauser's rigorous scholarship and enhanced by Sarnath Banerjee's wry illustrations, this utterly gripping book playfully melds meticulous research with imaginative storytelling to create a graphic narrative about pandemics and reflect on how societies and individuals tend to react when faced with an adversary that is, literally, larger than life.

JULIA HAUSER is a senior lecturer in Modern History at the University of Kassel, Germany, and an alumna of the Arab–German Young Academy of Sciences and Humanities (AGYA). She has authored several works of non-fiction.

SARNATH BANERJEE has published five works of graphic fiction.





In 1947, Kamaladevi Chattopadhyay made an unexpected visit to a cavernous government building in New Delhi to confront one of the



gravest crises facing newly-independent India – the fate of millions of refugees pouring across the new borders with Pakistan. She managed to procure a piece of land where a model town would be built to house 30,000 people. This town is today's Faridabad.

This is just one of the many efforts – often forgotten – made by an indomitable woman who strove to empower others throughout her life. She dreamt of an India that was free not just of colonial rule but of the shackles of poverty, caste oppression and gender disparities. 




For many indigenous peoples, land and the landscape are like religion. Theirs are not structured, efficient communities; nor are such considered

The open spaces, communities and the wilderness that the adivasis call home have all been shrinking rapidly in recent times, however, and are in danger of being lost forever. Hills of Assam in 1944 was the turning point in the Burma Campaign of the Second World War. It was at these twin battles that the Japanese invasion of India was stopped, with the Allies subsequently driving them out of Burma in 1945. The Japanese lost some 30,000 men, with another 23,000 injured, in what is considered one of their greatest ever defeats on land.

In April 2013, Imphal-Kohima was named 'Britain's Greatest Battle' by the UK's National Army Museum. Indians fought on both sides – as part of the British Army and alongside the Japanese as soldiers of the Indian National Army (INA). This book is the first battlefield guide for Imphal and Kohima and makes extensive use of maps and present-day photographs of the sites to tell the thrilling, tragic story of the historic battle of Imphal–Kohima, 1944.

HEMANT SINGH KATOCH is an independent scholar. His research has focused on the Battles of Imphal and Kohima of 1944, and he has designed and conducted battlefield tours around them.
